DOG FRIENDLY

We welcome your dogs! All dogs must be kept on a hand-held leash, maximum of 6 feet in length. Remember to pick up your pet waste.



PRIMITIVE CAMPING

MULTI-USE TRAILS

MCEP offers multi-use trails with scenic boardwalks for hikers and equestrian and bike riders. Remember to pick up your horse waste.

In addition to hiking, biking and horseback riding trails, MCEP provides great opportunities for fishing, birding and wildlife viewing.

All plants and animals are protected, *take only photos.*

All trails are available for *hikers* and *equestrians* and *bike riders.*

Seasonally, there may be *water* on the trails.

Leave No Trace—If you pack it in, please pack it out.

Remember to *pick up* and *properly dispose* of *dog* and *horse waste* in trash receptacles. This helps prevent bacteria impacting the environment or entering the waterway.

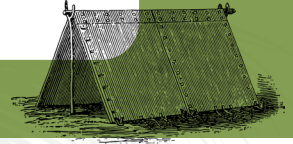
