ADMINISTRATIVE DECLARATION OF FIFTY-FIRST EXTENSION OF THE STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NO. 2024-42

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2024, pursuant to Florida Statutes Chapter 252, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order number 24-214, declaring a state of emergency in numerous counties, including Sarasota County; directing the Division of Emergency Management to execute the State's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan; and authorizing each political subdivision within the State of Florida, pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 252.38(3)(a), to waive certain procedures and formalities otherwise required by law that are in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2024, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. declared a national emergency as of October 5, 2024, related to the emergency conditions resulting from Hurricane Milton; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2024, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 24-215, which amended Executive Order 24-214, and extended the state of emergency to fifty-one counties; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2024, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 24-264, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2025, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 25-26, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended by Executive Order 24-264; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2025, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 25-68, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended by Executive Order 25-26; and

WHEREAS, on May 29, 2025, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 25-119, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended by Executive Order 25-68; and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2025, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 25-150, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended by Executive Order 25-119; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2025, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 25-191, renewing for sixty (60) days the state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended by Executive Order 25-150; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes Section 252.38(3)(a) gives authority to public subdivisions to declare and enact a state of local emergency for a period of up to seven (7) days and to take certain measures that are in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2024, the City Commission of the City of North Port, Florida adopted Ordinance No. 2024-42, declaring a state of local emergency due to Hurricane Milton; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2024-42 conferred on the City Manager or designee the power and authority set forth in Florida Statutes Section 252.38(3)(a); and

WHEREAS, the City Manager issued an administrative declaration extending the state of local emergency on October 21, 2024, October 28, 2024, November 4, 2024, November 11, 2024, November 18, 2024, November 25, 2024, December 2, 2024, December 9, 2024, December 16, 2024, December 23, 2024, December 30, 2024, January 6, 2025, January 13, 2025, January 20, 2025, January 27, 2025, February 3, 2025, February 10, 2025, February 17, 2025, February 24, 2025, March 3, 2025, March 10, 2025, March 17, 2025, March 24, 2025, March 31, 2025, April 7, 2025, April 14, 2025, April 21, 2025, April 28, 2025, May 5, 2025, May 12, 2025, May 19, 2025, May 26, 2025, June 2, 2025, June 9, 2025, June 16, 2025, June 23, 2025, June 30, 2025, July 7, 2025, July 14, 2025, July 21, 2025, July 28, 2025, August 4, 2025, August 11, 2025, August 18, 2025, August 25, 2025, September 1, 2025, September 8, 2025, September 15, 2025, September 22, 2025 and September 29, 2025; and


WHEREAS, the impact of Hurricane Milton poses an immediate and present danger to the public health, safety, or welfare to the City of North Port, Florida, and its residents, thereby warranting the extension of this state of local emergency.

THEREFORE, IN HIS EMERGENCY AUTHORITY, THE CITY MANAGER OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA DECLARES:

1. The state of local emergency related to Hurricane Milton is extended as permitted by law and authorized by Ordinance No. 2024-42.
2. By this declaration, the City of North Port invokes the emergency management powers granted to it pursuant to Section 252.38, Florida Statutes, its adopted emergency management plan, and all related Executive Orders of the Governor of the State of Florida.
3. By this declaration, the City Manager invokes all powers and authority granted to him or his designee in Ordinance No. 2024-42.

This declaration is effective at 10:20 A.M. on October 6, 2025, and remains in effect until it expires by operation of law or until the emergency conditions no longer exist as determined by the City Manager.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 25-191

(Emergency Management – Extension of Executive Order 24-214 – Hurricane Milton)

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2024, I issued Executive Order 24-214, declaring a state of emergency for thirty-five counties due to the severe weather, heavy rainfall, flash flooding, river flooding, and gusty winds caused by Tropical Storm Milton; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2024, I issued Executive Order 24-215, which amended Executive Order 24-214, and extended the state of emergency to fifty-one counties; and

WHEREAS, the tropical system surged from a tropical storm to a category 5 hurricane in less than twenty-four hours on its trajectory in the Gulf of America; and

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2024, Hurricane Milton made landfall as a dangerous category 3 hurricane along Florida's Gulf Coast near Siesta Key, about five miles west of Sarasota; and

WHEREAS, the affected areas are still recovering from the damage caused by Hurricane Milton; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, and subsequently extended, expires on September 26, 2025, unless extended; and

WHEREAS, an extension of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, is necessary because recovery efforts and those affected by this disaster require the continued support of the State of Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Florida Constitution and by the Florida

Emergency Management Act, as amended, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1. The state of emergency and all provisions of Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, are renewed for sixty (60) days following the date of this Executive Order.

Section 2. Except as amended herein, Executive Order 24-214, as amended by Executive Order 24-215, is ratified and reaffirmed.

Section 3. This Executive Order is effective immediately.
